





The Recommendations

How to enhance sustainable procurement?

Sustainable procurement processes should be integrated with ethical standards

Buying entities should consider the difficulties of their potential suppliers

The selection of responsible suppliers must rely on a collaborative effort between different stakeholders along the supply chain

Avoid any form of trade limitation that is justified by supposed sustainability needs




