



MSMEs are key economic actors

MSMEs face many trade challenges

- Lack of skills and knowledge about international markets
 - \rightarrow issue of access to information
- Limited digital connectivity (developing countries)
- High fixed costs
- Non-tariff measures
- Access to finance (Rejection rate > 50% for SMEs)

How can the WTO help?

Transparency, provide access to information

Simplification of trade procedures (e.g., TFA)

Increase internal awareness among Members

Existing WTO references to SMEs

• Anti-dumping and SCM agreement:

"[t]he authorities shall take due account of any difficulties experienced by interested parties, in particular small companies, in supplying information requested, and shall provide any assistance practicable

- GPA work programme on SMEs (GPA/113) (2012)
- Work programme on e-commerce and small economies (1998)
 - CTD to examine the "effects of e-commerce on the trade and economic prospects of developing countries, notably of their SMEs, and means of maximizing possible benefits accruing to them";

- WTO Joint Statement Initiative MSMEs
- Other ongoing WTO discussions

MSME Informal Working Group

- Established in Buenos Aires (WT/MIN(17)/58/Rev.1)
 - 91 Members around 80% of world trade

 \rightarrow "horizontal, non-discriminatory solutions"

- Ministerial Package
 - Transparency cluster
 - → Global Trade HelpDesk (<u>http://www.globaltradehelpdesk.org</u>)
 - → Online web platform
 - → Trade Policy Reviews (TPRs)
 - → Integrate Database (IDB)
 - Thematic cluster
 - Trade facilitation
 - Access to trade finance
 - Conceptual cluster
 - Regulatory development

- Dialogue with the private sector (Newsletter)
- Coordination with WTO Committees

- MC12 (date TBD)
 - A ministerial declaration with recommendations:
 - At the level of the WTO: Policy & operational recommendations
 - Recommendations to policy makers

Other ongoing discussions outside the MSME Joint Initiative framework

- Market Access /TBT: discussions on transparency and notifications
- JSI on E-Commerce: e.g., de Minimis
- TRIPS Council: discussions on MSMEs, IP and innovation
- WTO Working Group on Trade, Debt and Finance (WGTDF): discussions on how to improve access to finance
- Multiagency partnerships:
 - Aid for Trade (A4T)
 - Enhanced Integrated Framework (EIF)
 - Standards and Trade Development Facility (STDF)
